

If you didn't make the trip down to the NVC Hall, you missed a special event. A number of us did make it down there and had a thoroughly enjoyable and memorable day. Frank Suhara was our host and Buck Weaver organized it. The picture above is taken in their museum room which is filled with interesting memorabilia primarily from WWII but also Korea and Vietnam. Below is the Hall of Honor. 21 of the plaques are for Medal of Honor recipients.



The NVC was comprised primarily of veterans from the 442nd Combat Regiment Team and the MIS (Military Intelligence Service). The latter were the 8,000 Japanese Americans who served in the Pacific and provided interpreter services, interrogation of prisoners, etc. The 442nd which served in France and Italy is the most highly decorated unit in US military history.

When I returned from a recent fishing trip, the message light on my phone was blinking. A number I didn't recognize showed up on caller ID so I figured it was just another of the hundred phone calls from the political candidates. I listened to the message anyway and, much to my surprise, one of the guys I had served with in Vietnam had called me. It had been 41 years or so since we had last spoken but we started up like it had been yesterday. He had been talking to his wife about our group and she told him to Google my name. Low and behold, I turned up on his search and he gave me a call. I just had my 45th high school reunion a few weeks earlier. A lot of the folks I graduated with had been classmates of mine since we were in kindergarten. As much as I liked all my old classmates, none had shared the experiences that Donny and I had gone through during our year in Vietnam. We didn't speak about the bad times, just about the good times, the bbq's and beer after weeks (or months) in the field, and the guys we knew back then, wondering what had happened to them. It was good to hear his voice after all these years.
